

Gift-Giving For Indigent Families Caps 2011 For NCF

Emphasizing generous giving, NCF met the year's end by distributing groceries and other needs to 25 indigent families near its vicinity.

Ten families each from the areas of Korokan and Sampalukan were given packages of rice, clothes and groceries on Christmas Day.



“They usually have three to five children for every family, and they could really use the help,” said Sis. Bella Figueras, an active church worker who keeps in touch with the residents.

Sister Figueras was in charge of previous year's regular Feeding Program in the area, as well as in the evangelism efforts through the Children's Ministry and the annual Daily Vacation Bible School.

She said that the gift packages - particularly the clothes - were gathered through the open hearts of donors who contributed both financially and in kind.

Members of NCF's Clayhouse Youth Ministry also made their efforts in reaching out to the needy.

As part of their Christmas Party on December 30, they also distributed canned goods, noodles and school supplies to five families Korokan.

These goods were gradually gathered by the youth during their weekly fellowship's exchange gifts in December.
